

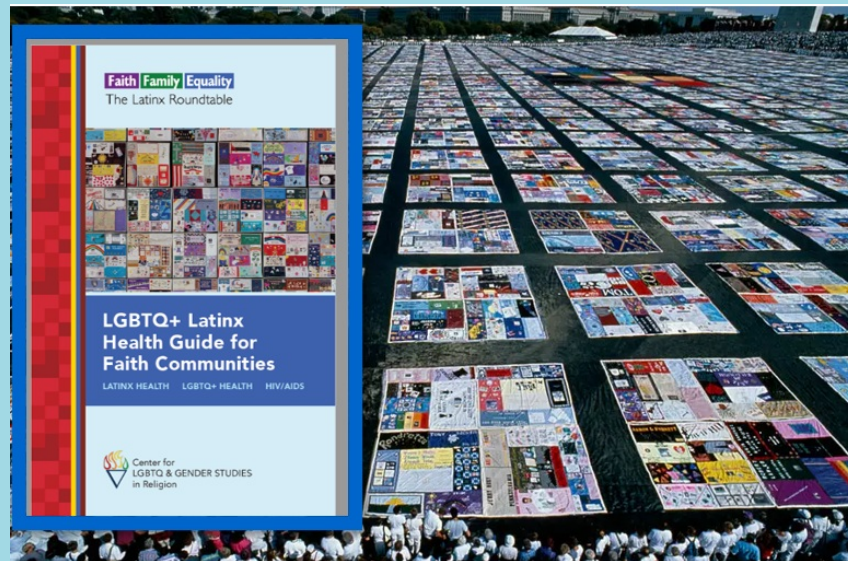

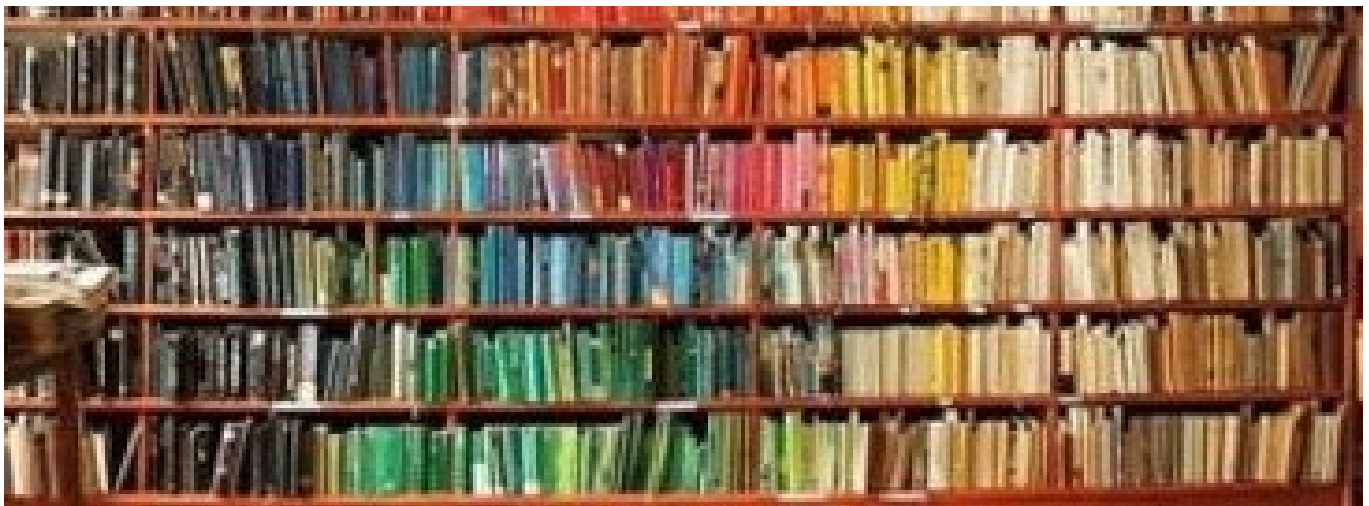


GenderQueering Hebrew with Rabbi Noa Sattah
