CLGS is a proud co-sponsor of the **Trans Seminarian Leadership Cohort**, which is a collaborative partnership between CLGS, the **Freedom Center for Social Justice**, and the **National LGBTQ Task Force**.

We invite you to view a recording of this recent CLGS *Queer & Latinx Faith Conversation* with Rev. **Rhina Ramos**, who shares her experiences working with LGBTQ communities in El Salvador. Originally from El Salvador, Rhina grew up at the time of the civil war in that country. Inscribed on her heart is the voice of Saint Oscar Romero of the Americas who denounced oppression from the pulpit.

Rev. Ramos graduated from Hofstra University School of Law in 1995 and earned an MDiv degree from Pacific School of Religion in 2003. She is an experienced community organizer, having led programs and campaigns for educational equity, labor rights, human rights of the LGBTQ community, international solidarity with El Salvador, and the prevention of domestic violence.


