Rev. Dr. Pamela Lightsey, Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs and Associate Professor of Professor of Constructive Theology at Meadville Lombard Theological School in Chicago, will speak on the ways that Black queer bodies are used to leverage the aspirations of political candidates, church leaders, and power elites.

In this, our *16th Annual CLGS Boswell Lecture*, Dr. Lightsey will also demonstrate the ways that the big lie – propaganda – is damaging the gains made during the Civil and LGBTQ Rights movements. While its primary focus will be the lives of Black queer women, this lecture will spotlight why all persons who believe in freedom and liberation must see this old hatred as a danger to all humanity.

CLGS is a proud co-sponsor of the **Trans Seminarian Leadership Cohort**, which is a collaborative partnership between CLGS, the **Freedom Center for Social Justice**, and the **National LGBTQ Task Force**.


One More Mountain to Climb: The Past, Present, and Future of LGBT Faith Leaders of African Descent
